



Working in Crowds Personal Safety Awareness

Introduction

This is a detailed and intense course fulfilling the requirement to give delegates as much safety information and advice as is possible, and is specifically for those working in areas where large and potentially hostile crowds are present. The course is predominantly theory based, but uses group activities and short practical exercises to reinforce the course objectives.

Aim

The aim of the course is to enhance the safety awareness of individuals operating in large crowd situations.

Target Audience

Anyone who may, potentially, be deployed into a large crowd situation.

Prerequisites

There are no prerequisites for this course.

Venue

The course is normally conducted at the customers' site. A room suitable for classroom work and the ability to move around the building and surrounding areas is required. Alternatively, the course can be held at one of our training sites.

Qualifications

This is a unique course and is recognised as such throughout the industry. Many of the major organisations are now insisting that anyone deploying to large crowd events must have received appropriate training. Prime will issue a passport which is accepted by most of the major broadcast organisations as evidence of completion of the course.

Course Design

The course consists predominantly of classroom-based lectures and discussions. Where local conditions allow, some of the principles discussed will be practiced.

Course Content

- Dealing with potential risks and threats
- Planning and preparing a deployment. Consideration is given to background information, equipment, contingency planning and travel
- Guidelines for safe movement. on foot to, from and during an event, both as an individual and as a team
- Guidelines on safe positioning during an event
- Profile awareness. including the importance of clothing, positioning, equipment, situation and the use of buildings
- Importance of good operating procedures. Includes advice about where to find up-to-date safety advice, appraisal of current safety procedures and assessment of contingency planning
- Marshalling of events and the affect this will have on safety
- Post Incident Procedures
